The present contempt petition has been filed for non-compliance of order dated 4.11.2016, operative part of which reads as under:-

“Keeping in view the above, this Court is of the opinion that the present writ petition has been rendered infructuous to the extent of issuance of direction to hold the said examinations as part of it has been done and the rest is in progress. The State shall accordingly ensure that the students of the 2015-16 batch will give their examination by December, 2016. It is further directed that respondents shall ensure that the Detailed Mark Sheets (DMCs) shall be supplied to the students of 2013-14 within a period of two months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.”

Replies on behalf of respondents No.4 and 5 have been filed in Court today.

As per the replies filed by respondents No.4 and 5, the order has been complied with.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner states that the direction was to hold examination for the year 2015-16 batch in December, 2016, whereas the same was not held even by June, 2017.

Heard.

The examination was required to be held in December 2016, the petitioner filed the present contempt petition almost after six months i.e. in July, 2017. In any case, the fact remains that as of now the examinations have since been held, results declared and DMCs have also been supplied to the students. Hence, no useful purpose would be served to proceed with the present contempt petition.

In view of the above, the present contempt petition stands disposed of with a direction that the respondents shall complete the three years course in three years itself.

Rule issued to the respondent stands discharged.
