The petitioner had filed a criminal complaint before the SHO, Police Station, Cantonment, Amritsar, with regard to causing of injuries and harassment by Kulwinder Singh Maakhni, Santokh Singh and Lovely. Connivance of the police officials was also alleged.

Since no action was being taken, the petitioner filed *CRM-M-14931 of 2016*, which was disposed of vide order dated 03.05.2016 (**Annexure P-1**), with the direction '*to Commissioner of Police, Amritsar, to look into his grievance and take action in accordance with law.*'

Since no worthwhile action is alleged to have been taken, hence

the present contempt petition.

Upon notice, a reply by way of affidavit has been filed by the Commissioner of Police, Amritsar.

In the reply, it is stated that a thorough enquiry has been made and as per enquiry report (**Annexure R-1**), the allegations levelled by the petitioner are found false.

Learned State Counsel submits that a '*Kalendra*' under Section 182 IPC has been recorded against the petitioner for furnishing false information.

In view of the above, no further proceedings in the present contempt are warranted.

Dismissed.

Rule is discharged.
