AUGUSTINE GEORGE MASIH, J. (ORAL)

Having heard the counsel for the parties and keeping in view the additional affidavit of the Secretary to Government of Punjab, Department of School Education dated 15.06.2018, this Court is satisfied that the order passed by this Court has been duly complied with although the counsel for the petitioner states that notional pay fixation of the petitioner and the consequential benefits have been wrongly granted to the petitioner as his pay has been reduced whereas it should have been increased on his promotion to the post of Principal. He further states that this reduction in notional fixation of pay has been made without giving an opportunity to the petitioner. That apart, he states that the payments, which have been released to the petitioner, are belated and, therefore, he is entitled to the interest thereon.

These contentions, as raised by the counsel for the petitioner, can be agitated before the appropriate Forum in accordance with law.

The present contempt petition, in the considered view of this Court, has been rendered infructuous and the same is disposed of as such with liberty to the petitioner to avail of his remedy in accordance with law.

Rule issued to the respondent stands discharged.
