Perusal of the reply, which has been filed by the respondent,
indicates that the representation of the petitioner, after due consideration,
has been decided holding therein that no cognizable offence is found to
have been committed by the persons against whom a complaint has been
submitted by the petitioner.

Learned counsel for the respondent has produced a copy of the order dated 25.05.2017 passed by the Additional Chief Judicial Magistrate, Chandigarh, according to which, an application under Section 156 (3) of the Code of Criminal Procedure, directing Station House Officer, Police Station Sector-26, Chandigarh, for registration of an FIR under Sections 420, 453, 467, 468, 471 and 120-B of the Indian Penal Code, against Ms. Babita wife of Sh. Suresh Nayar and Sh. Suresh Nayar, has been dismissed.

In view of the above, the order passed by this Court having been duly complied with renders the present contempt petition infructuous. Disposed of as such. Petitioner may avail of his remedy in accordance with law, if available.
