Petitioner had filed a CWP No.23095 of 2013 seeking issuance of direction to the respondents to consider the claim of the her son, namely, Virender Singh for compassionate appointment under Ex-Gratia Scheme and grant the benefits admissible under Ex Gratia scheme along with interest to the petitioner on account of death of her husband which was disposed of vide order dated 30.03.2017 (P-1) passed by this Court directing the respondents to release the benefit as per her option within a further period of three months and in case due benefit is not granted to the petitioner within the stipulated period, she would be entitled to claim the same with interest @ 12% per annum from the date(s) the amount(s) fell due. Since the order dated 30.03.2017 passed by this Court was not complied with. Hence the present contempt petition.

Upon notice short reply by way of affidavit of Mr. Rajiv Rattan, Director Secondary Education, Haryana, Panchkula was filed wherein it is stated that the sanction of Monthly Financial Assistance was issued by the Department vide order dated 02.11.2017 and further a sanction of payment of Rs.26,721/- on account of interest on delayed MFA benefits has been issued vide order dated 07.12.2017 (Annexures **R-I** and **R-II**) respectively and as such compliance of the order passed by this Court has been made to which learned Counsel for the petitioner also conceded.

In view of the above, present contempt petition is hereby dismissed as infructuous.
