JASWANT SINGH, J. (ORAL)

Learned counsel for the respondents, on instructions from Mr. Anil Kumar, Sr. Assistant, Chandigarh Housing Board, states that the claim for allotment of dwelling unit of three bedroom flat to the claimant-Goverdhan Singh (petitioner) under the *Oustees Quota* as per the scheme of 1996 in compliance of the directions dated 05.12.2013 (**Annexure P-1**) passed in *CWP No. 5317 of 1993*, titled as “*Goverdhan Singh Versus Chandigarh Administration and Others*” has since been satisfied by issuance of Acceptance-cum-Demand Letter dated 30.10.2017 in favour of his LR-son Dharmender Kumar, as the remaining LRs had submitted their “No Objection Certificate” in favour of the said son. He, thus, submits that the present contempt has become infructuous.

Learned proxy counsel for petitioner states that she has no instructions, however, in the light of the statement made by the counsel respondents at the Bar, has no objection to the disposal of the present

contempt petition as infructuous.

In view of the above, present contempt is **dismissed as infructuous**, however, in case of any factual error, the petitioner is free to seek the revival of the contempt within three months from today.
