AUGUSTINE GEORGE MASIH, J. (ORAL)

In compliance with the order dated 25.05.2017 passed by this Court in CWP No.11723 of 2017, whereby, directions were issued to the respondents without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case to consider the legal notice dated 22.03.2017 submitted by the petitioner for grant of permit for operation of the Light Motor Vehicle, which was ordered to be considered and decided within a period of two months from the date of receipt of certified copy of the order. This order dated 25.05.2017 was duly served upon the respondent. Respondent has filed reply to the contempt petition by way of affidavit of the State Transport Commissioner, Punjab, dated 15.10.2018, according to which, on consideration of the legal notice of the petitioner, the claim has been rejected vide order dated 21.07.2017 (Annexure R-1).

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In view of the above, the present contempt petition has been rendered infructuous.

Learned counsel for the petitioner states that the present contempt petition has not been rendered infructuous in the light of the judgment dated 20.12.2012, especially paras 115 to 123 thereof.

Be that as it may, the fact remains that the order which has been passed by this Court was limited to the extent of consideration of the legal notice as submitted by the petitioner, which on consideration has been duly take note of and an order has been passed by the respondent. In case the petitioner is aggrieved of the decision taken by the respondent, he may avail of his remedy in accordance with law.

Disposed of as infructuous.

Rule issued to the respondent(s) stands discharged.
