JASWANT SINGH, J. (ORAL)

The petitioner (Akashpreet Kaur), is the widowed daughter-in-law of respondent (Banta Singh). After the death of Lakhveer Singh, husband of the petitioner, a compromise is stated to have been effected between the petitioner and the respondent, whereby the custody of the two minor children was handed over to the petitioner and *inter alia* respondent was to deposit a sum of Rs.5,000/- per annum in the name of the two minor children.

The present contempt has been filed with the allegation that the respondent has failed to deposit the aforesaid annual amount since the year 2011.

Upon notice, reply has been filed. Apart from the objection of the contempt being barred by limitation, it is submitted that the petitioner has performed her re-marriage and as per Clause 10 of the compromise, the respondent is not bound to deposit the aforesaid amount of Rs.5,000/- on account of re-marriage.

After hearing counsel for the parties and in view of the averments made in the written statement, no further action is warranted in the present contempt petition.

Dismissed.
