Jhuggi No.58 of the petitioner situated in Nehru Colony Sector 52, Chandigarh was demolished and, therefore, his writ petition was disposed of for considering his case for allotment of one room tenement under the Chandigarh Small Flats Scheme 2006. Since the needful was not done within time, hence the present contempt petition.

At the time of hearing, learned Counsel for the petitioner submits that the present contempt petition has become infructuous as the petitioner has been allotted flat no.202-C in Mauli Jagran, Chandigarh on licence basis for a period of 20 years vide memo no.CHB/CHFS/2006/11,090 dated 19.09.2017 and the possession of the

same has also been handed over to the petitioner which fact is conceded to by learned Counsel for the respondents also.

In view of the above, present contempt petition is hereby dismissed as infructuous.
