Petitioner alleges violation of order dated 04.08.2017 passed by the writ court. Operative part thereof reads as under:-

“ Keeping in view report dated 23.1.2017 of the Enquiry officer and for the reasons recorded in the order of the CAT, we do not find any ground to interfere and uphold the same. Accordingly, the writ petition is disposed of with a direction to the petitioners to release the DCRG to applicant-respondent No.1 within a period of one month from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order in terms of the order passed by the CAT. ”

At the time of hearing, learned Counsel for the petitioner submits that the present contempt petition has become infructuous as the order dated 04.08.2017 passed by this Court stands complied with by

releasing the necessary payments along with interest.

Learned Counsel for the respondents has filed reply by way of affidavit of Sh. Rajiv Kumar Gupta, PCS, Additional Registrar, Cooperative Societies, Sector 17, Chandigarh stating therein that all the amount with regard to DCRG has been paid to the petitioner along with interest at the rate of 9% upto 15.01.2018.

In view of the aforesaid agreed stand, present contempt petition is hereby dismissed as infructuous.
