In compliance of the order dated 14.06.2016 (**Annexure P-1**)
passed by this Court in CWP No.12084 of 2016, filed by the petitioners,
namely Dr. Cheta Singh and Dr. Anjuman, they were granted admission in
the Post Graduate course of MD/MS in Pathology/Anesthesiology
respectively for the academic Session 2016-2017 in GMCH, Sector 32,
Chandigarh.

Since, on interpretation of the order passed by the LPA Bench
filed by rival claim of Dr. Reecha, the admission of the two petitioners was
discharged, hence the present contempt was filed.
