Prayer in this application is for direction to the tenant/petitioner to pay/deposit mesne profits for use and occupation of the premises in dispute.

Counsel for the parties would state that as dispute between the parties has been settled by way of compromise, the main case (CR No.1310 of 2016) may be taken up on board and disposed of in terms of compromise arrived at between the parties.

In view of joint request made by counsel for the parties, the main petition (CR No.1310 of 2016) is taken on board today itself.

Counsel for the parties, on instructions from Rajnish Kumar Sharma and Inderjit Singh Kalsi, present in person, would state that dispute between the parties has been settled by way of compromise deed dated 20.07.2018 and the petition may be disposed of in terms of settlement recorded in compromise deed dated 20.07.2018 and the same may be taken

on record. The original compromise deed is taken on record. The petition stands disposed of in the light of terms and conditions recorded in compromise deed dated 20.07.2018. The parties shall remain bound by the terms and conditions of the compromise. All miscellaneous applications filed in the main petition and subsequent thereto stand disposed of with disposal of the main case.

Counsel for the respondent would state that even dispute with regard to liability of the petitioner to pay property tax also stands settled and in view thereof, respondent would withdraw the suit filed by him with regard to property tax.
