JASWANT SINGH, J.(ORAL)

Petitioner is an accused in FIR No.259 dated 18.11.2017 registered at P.S. Jandiala, District Amritsar (Rural), *inter alia* for offence of cheating. He alleges that before registration of the case his contentions in the legal notice have not been noticed and, therefore, the order dated 11.09.2017 passed by this Court has been violated.

After hearing Counsel for the petitioner, no case for invoking the contempt jurisdiction is made out. It is well settled that in case any criminal complaint reveals commission of a cognizable offence an FIR is required to be registered. The petitioner stands protected in as much as this court has already ordered that a notice under Section 160 Cr.PC would be issued to him before summoning him.

In view of the above, finding no merit in the present contempt

petition, the same is hereby dismissed.
