JASWANT SINGH, J. (ORAL)

This Court, vide order dated 23.01.2018 had passed the
following order:-

“ Vide order dated 09.08.2016, the respondents were directed to release all the pensionary benefits, including family pension, gratuity, leave encashment, GPF, Ex-gratia and arrears of the revision of pay etc. to the petitioner as per Rules within a period of three months. With regard to claim of compassionate appointment, respondent Nos.1 & 2 were directed to consider the claim of the petitioner and pass appropriate order in accordance with Rules/instructions within a period of three months.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the order passed by this Court has not been complied with whereas learned State counsel submits that an amount of Rs.1 lac has

been deposited in the account of the petitioner and because of pendency of LPA No.1094 of 2017 the remaining part of the order has not been complied with. On perusal of order dated 03.07.2017 passed in said LPA it shows that even notice has not been issued. It appears that there is delay in filing of the appeal and time was given to explain the delay.

The compliance of the order be made within a period of six weeks from today, failing which respondents are directed to come present in the Court on the next date of hearing. It is also made clear, that the LPA is still pending, the benefits be released subject to decision of LPA.

Adjourned to 17.04.2018. ”

Upon notice, separate replies on behalf of respondent Nos.1 & 2 stand filed.

In the reply/affidavit of respondent No.2, it is stated that in view of the order dated 23.01.2018, passed by this Court, the payments of leave encashment, ex-gratia, arrears of suspension period, G.I.S, G.P.F. etc have been released to the petitioner. So far as the case of the petitioner regarding appointment on compassionate ground is concerned, the same is under process, for which she has been asked for submitting requisite affidavit, so as to her case could be finalized.

In view of the above, learned counsel for the parties concede that no further action is warranted in the present contempt petition.

Disposed of.

Rule is discharged.
