Impugned in the present revision petition is the order dated 27.11.2017, (Annexure P-1), passed by learned Civil Judge (Junior Division), Sangur vide which an application filed under Section 151 of the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908 was allowed to the effect that police help was allowed to implement the injunction order dated 30.5.2016.

Heard.

It comes out that learned trial Court during the pendency of the suit for permanent injunction and possession passed the injunction order on 30.5.2016. Plaintiff claimed that defendant is violating that order, therefore, prayed for police help was made which has been allowed.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has conceded that the said injunction order was challenged before the lower Appellate Court and the appeal remained unsuccessful. Once, the injunction order is there, it has to be implemented, if necessary, with the help of the police. The fact that even before this Court, defendant-petitioner against whom the injunction order is passed, challenging the validity of the order goes to show that he is not ready to comply with the said injunction order. There is no illegality or infirmity in providing the police help in implementing the injunction order.

Dismissed.

Since the main petition is dismissed, the miscellaneous application pending, if any, also stands disposed of.
