Through present revision petition, orders passed by the trial Court affirmed in appeal deciding the application for grant of temporary injunction has been assailed. The defendant-petitioner who is sister-in-law of the plaintiff-respondent, a widow of a pre-deceased brother of the petitioner. The plaintiff filed the suit with the assertion that her sister-in-law is wanting to forcibly dispossess her from the land on the basis of sale deeds. Both the Courts have found that the petitioner is married residing in a separate village. The Courts have found that the plaintiff-respondent is prima facie proved to be in possession.

In such circumstances, this Court does not find any ground to interfere in exercise of its revisional jurisdiction. However, since the suit is pending for the last 3 years, it is directed that the Civil Court would make an sincere attempt to dispose of the suit, within a period of one year, from the date of receipt of a certified copy of this order.

Revision petition is dismissed.
