This order shall dispose of aforesaid Criminal Misc.Nos.M-10500, 15579 and 16340 of 2018, filed by the petitioners under Section 438 Cr.P.C. for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.103 dated 21.02.2018, registered under Sections 148, 149, 323, 307, 452, 325, 406 IPC, at Police Station Sadar Ballabgarh, District Faridabad, Haryana.

The allegation against the petitioners is that they alongwith their associates caused injuries on the person of four persons. Earlier the offence under Section 307 IPC was added and now the said offence has been deleted.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from Sub Inspector Azad Singh, has admitted the fact regarding the deletion of offence under Section 307 IPC and also stated that the petitioners have joined the investigation, nothing is to be recovered from them and they are no more required for custodial interrogation.

In the circumstances, without going into the merits of the case, I do not deem it appropriate to deny the concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioners in the present case.

Resultantly, the interim orders dated 14.03.2018 (in Criminal Misc.No.M-10500 of 2018), 19.04.2018 (in Criminal Misc.No.M-15579 of 2018) and 21.04.2018 (in Criminal Misc.No.M-16340 of 2018) are made absolute subject to the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

Accordingly, all the three petitions stand allowed.
