For the reasons mentioned in the application, the same is allowed and the affidavit of the petitioner is taken on record subject to the just exceptions.

CRM-M-10829-2018:-

On 06.04.2018 the following order was passed:-

“At the very outset, learned counsel for the petitioner states that the petitioner is ready to settle the issue by making payment to the

complainant. Petitioner is ready to part with an amount of Rs.1 lac at the first instance within two weeks and remaining amount of Rs.4,40,000/- be allowed to be paid in four installments i.e. Rs.1,10,000/- each spreading within a period of four months thereafter.

In view of readiness and willingness of the petitioner, let a specific affidavit be filed by the petitioner before this Court within two weeks undertaking to pay the aforesaid amount in the manner as stated above.

Adjourned to 20.04.2018.

Till the next date of hearing, arrest of the petitioner shall remain stayed.”

Today in compliance of the said order, affidavit furnished by the petitioner has already been taken on record.

The petitioner has produced a demand draft bearing No.979794 dated 20.04.2018 for a sum of Rs. 1 Lac in the name of Bharat Bhushan, the same has been handed over to learned counsel for the complainant. A photocopy of the DD has been retained on the file. The complainant himself is also present in the Court. As per the undertaking given by the petitioner, remaining amount of Rs. 4,40,000/- shall be paid in four equal installments of Rs. 1,10,000/- each within a period of 04 months from today.

In view of readiness and willingness of the petitioner,

let the remaining amount be paid in 4 installments, the break up of which can be given as under:-

1st Installment - To be paid on or before 20th of May 2018

2nd Installment- To be paid on or before 20th of June 2018

3rd Installment- To be paid on or before 20th of July 2018

4th Installment-To be paid on or before 20th of August 2018

With the aforesaid under-standing between the parties, this petition is disposed of. Interim order to continue.

However, it is made clear that even single default in paying the installments by the due date would entail in dismissal of the petition without making any further reference to the Court.

The petitioner has also mentioned factum of four cheques in the undertaking. Since the plea is beyond the scope of understanding between the parties, therefore, this Court does not wish to take any cognizance of the aforesaid plea.
