The petitioner seeks anticipatory bail in case FIR No. 24 dated 02.02.2018, registered at Police Station Zira, District Ferozepur under Sections 420/120-B IPC.

Learned counsel for the petitioner has contended that the money, if at all was paid to Sarbjit Kaur and the petitioner is in no way involved in the transaction and, thus, she deserves to be granted anticipatory bail.

I have gone through the contents of the FIR. According to its contents the petitioner as well as her daughter Sarbjit Kaur had held out a promise to the complainant that after marriage of the complainant with Sarbjit Kaur he would also be sent to Australia on Spouse Visa. The FIR is under Sections 420, 120-B IPC and, therefore, it does not lie in the mouth of counsel for the petitioner to contend that the petitioner is in no way involved in the transaction.

No ground is made out to grant anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

The petition is dismissed.
