ARVIND SINGH SANGWAN, J. :

Prayer in this petition is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in FIR No.85 dated 30.01.2017 registered under Section 379 IPC at Police Station City Sirsa, District Sirsa.

On 24.01.2018, the following order was passed:

“Counsel for the petitioner has submitted that the petitioner was earlier involved in another FIR i.e. FIR No.201 dated 30.09.2017 under Sections 379, 483 and 411 IPC registered at Police Station Kotwali, Patiala, District Patiala with the allegations that the petitioner has purchased a vehicle bearing registration No.HR24-V-3350 along with Yudhvir Singh @ Yudh from one Ashish Kumar and that Swift car was bearing a fake registration No.PB22-J-4545. It is further submitted that the petitioner was arrested in the said FIR and was granted regular bail by Chief Judicial Magistrate, Patiala on 30.10.2017. Counsel for the petitioner has further submitted that in the present case i.e. FIR No.85 dated 30.01.2017 registered under Section 379 IPC at Police Station Sirsa, District Sirsa, in which the same Swift car bearing its original

registration No. HR-24-3350 is involved and the same has been registered regarding theft of this vehicle by its registered owner.

Counsel for the State, on instructions from HC Ashok Kumar, has not disputed the factual position that the FIR No.85 dated 30.01.2017 was registered regarding the theft of Swift car bearing registration No.HR-24-3350 by its registered owner and the FIR No.201 dated 30.09.2017 was registered at Police Station Kotwali, Patiala, District Patiala regarding recovery of the said car from the petitioner in which the car was recovered and the petitioner was arrested and later on, he was granted the concession of regular bail after about 02 months.

List again on 29.05.2018.”

Learned State counsel on instructions from HC Rajinder Singh, submits that the petitioner has joined the investigation and is no more required.

In view of the same, the petition is allowed and the anticipatory bail granted to the petitioner vide order dated 24.01.2018 is made absolute.
