Petitioner seeks grant of anticipatory bail in case bearing FIR No. 112 dated 23.7.2014, registered under Sections 452, 323, 324, 379, 427, 506, 447, 448, 148, 149 IPC at Police Station Division No.4, Ludhiana City District Ludhiana.

On 21.3.2018, following order was passed by this Court:-

“Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner is brother-in-law of the complainant.

Complainant started living in live-in relationship with one Ranjit Kaur. There was a dispute with regard to landed property between the complainant and his son Jagdeep Singh. A compromise was effected between the parties before the police. The said compromise was not honoured by the complainant in respect of buying 100 square

yards plot for Jagdeep Singh. In case of Jagdeep Singh, CRM-M No.7980 of 2018 is pending for 18.04.2018 with interim relief.

Notice of motion for 18.04.2018.

In the meanwhile, petitioner is directed to appear before the SHO/Investigating Officer on 24.03.2018 at 11.00 A.M. to join investigation and in the event of his arrest, he shall be enlarged on ad interim bail, subject to his furnishing adequate bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer. However, petitioner shall abide by the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.”

Learned State counsel, on instructions from HC Tarsem Singh, submitted that the petitioner has joined the investigation on 24.3.2018 and is no more required for further investigation.

In view of above, order dated 21.3.2018 is hereby made absolute.

Petition stands disposed of.
