AUGUSTINE GEORGE MASIH, J. (ORAL)

By this order, I propose to decide two petitions i.e. *CRM-M No.11904 of 2018* titled as *Daljit Kaur and others Versus State of Punjab and another*, where prayer is for quashing of FIR No.200 dated 26.09.2017 registered under Sections 323, 324, 452, 427, 148, 149 IPC, at Police Station Jandiala, District Amritsar and all other consequential proceedings arising therefrom and *CRM-M No.11264 of 2018* titled as *Sukhwinder Singh and others Versus State of Punjab and another*, where prayer is for quashing of DDR No.18 dated 30.09.2017 registered under Sections 452, 427, 323, 324, 148, 149 IPC, at Police Station Jandiala, District Amritsar, on the basis of compromise dated 28.02.2018 entered into

between the parties.

In pursuance to the separate orders passed by this Court on 21.03.2018 in these petitions, parties appeared before the Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Amritsar, and got recorded their respective statements on 28.03.2018. In pursuance to the statements, which have been made before the Court below, the learned Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Amritsar, has come to a conclusion that the compromise which has been entered into between the parties is genuine, without any fear, pressure, threat or coercion and out of free will.

On the basis of the report dated 02.04.2018, counsel for the parties have stated that in the light of the report of the Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Amritsar, the present petitions deserve to be allowed as there is an amicable resolution of the dispute between the parties and it would serve the interest of the society and the parties in both the cases and all consequential proceedings in pursuance to the respective complaints are hereby quashed.

Keeping in view the report submitted by Judicial Magistrate Ist Class, Amritsar, as also keeping in view the principles laid down by judgment of Supreme Court in ***Madan Mohan Abbot Versus State of Punjab 2008 (2) RCR (Criminal) 429*** and in ***Criminal Appeal No.1723 of 2017*** titled as ***Parbatbhai Aahir @ Parbatbhai Bhimsinhbhai Karmur and others Versus State of Gujarat and another***, decided on 04.10.2017, the present petitions are allowed and FIR No.200 dated 26.09.2017 registered under Sections 323, 324, 452, 427,

148, 149 IPC, at Police Station Jandiala, District Amritsar and DDR No.18 dated 30.09.2017 registered under Sections 452, 427, 323, 324, 148, 149 IPC, at Police Station Jandiala, District Amritsar, and all other consequential proceedings arising therefrom, are hereby quashed qua the petitioners.
