This common order shall dispose of above mentioned two criminal petitions as they arise out of the same FIR.

The petitioners pray for grant of anticipatory bail in FIR No.89 dated 08.07.2016 (Annexure P-1) under Sections 406, 420, 120-B of IPC and Section 13 of Punjab Travel Professional Regulation Act, 2014, registered at Police Station Division No.4, Jalandhar (Punjab).

Vide orders dated 21.03.2018 and 04.04.2018, the petitioners were granted concession of interim anticipatory bail and were directed to join the investigation and hand over a demand draft of Rs. 2,00,000/- either to the complainant or to the Investigating Officer, subject to the final outcome of the case.

In pursuance to the aforesaid directions, learned counsel for the petitioners had handed over a demand draft of Rs. 1,00,000/-, favouring the complainant, to the Investigating Officer HC Anil Kumar on 06.09.2018 in Court itself.

The matter has been taken up today.

Learned counsel for the petitioners submits that petitioners will pay the balance amount of Rs. 1,00,000/- within a period of two months from today.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Gurjeet Singh, submits that petitioners are still required for further investigation for completing certain documents.

In view of the above, these petitions are allowed and the interim bail granted to the petitioners, vide orders dated 21.03.2018 and 04.04.2018, is made absolute subject to the condition that petitioners will hand over the balance amount of Rs. 1,00,000/-, by way of a demand draft favouring the complainant on or before 13.01.2019, and will join the investigation as and when required by the Investigating Officer. The petitioners shall also abide by the conditions as envisaged under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C.

It is made clear that in case the petitioners are called for

joining the investigation and they fail to do the same, it will be open for the prosecution to apply for cancellation of bail.
