Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that all other 6 co-accused of the petitioner have been acquitted by the trial Court holding that the prosecution had not been able to bring home the guilty of the accused even on the basis of photographs produced before that Court.

The petitioner is stated to be the lessee running the hotel where allegedly immoral trafficking was taking place.

The petitioner is in custody in view of the fact that he was not tried alongwith the co-accused, he having been earlier declared to be a proclaimed offender.

He is also stated to be about 72 years of age.

Keeping in view the fact that all other co-accused have been acquitted with the entire immoral trafficking being doubted by the learned trial Court, the petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be admitted to bail, on his furnishing adequate bail and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the Duty Magistrate/Illaqa Magistrate.
