Prayer made in this application is for impleading complainant Inderjit Singh to be party respondent No.2 in the present petition.

Learned counsel for the applicant/petitioners submits that petitioners are accused of offences under Sections 419, 420, 465, 467, 468, 471, 120-B IPC registered in case bearing FIR No.10 dated 12.01.2018 at Police Station Fattu Dzinga, District Kapurthala and they have settled their controversy by

way of amicable resolution of dispute. CRM-M No.18241 of 2018 has been filed for quashing of aforesaid FIR on the basis of compromise.

For the reasons mentioned in the application, the same is allowed and complainant Inderjit Singh is ordered to be impleaded as party respondent No.2 in the present petition.

Amended memo of parties is taken on record.

Main case

Vide order dated 26.04.2018, learned State counsel sought time to verify the factum of compromise.

Today, learned State counsel on instructions from HC Saranjit Singh submits that parties have effected the compromise.

In view of above, petitioners are directed to appear before the SHO/Investigating Officer to join investigation on 08.05.2018 at 11.00 AM and in the event of their arrest, they shall be enlarged on anticipatory bail on their furnishing requisite bail bonds/surety bonds to the satisfaction of Arresting Officer subject to the following conditions:-

1. That they shall make themselves available for interrogation by a police officer as and when required:
2. That they shall not directly or indirectly make any inducement, threat or promise to any person acquainted

with the facts of the case so as to dissuade him from disclosing such facts to the Court or to any police officer and;

3. That they shall not leave India without prior permission of the Court.

Disposed of accordingly.
