The present petition has been filed under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners in case FIR No.90 dated 03.06.2016 registered under Sections 419, 420, 120-B of the Indian Penal Code and Section 82 of Registration Act, 1908 at Police Station Division No.6, Ludhiana.

It is contended by learned counsel for the petitioner that in terms of the order dated 02.04.2018, the petitioner has joined investigation on 08.04.2018 and his custodial interrogation is no longer required.

On instructions from ASI Rajwant Singh, the above factual position is duly acknowledged by learned State counsel and stated that the custodial interrogation of the petitioner is no longer required.

Learned counsel for the complainant has opposed the bail application in view of the fact that there is no question of bonafide purchasers involved in this case.

Be that as it may, the civil suit is already pending and learned trial Court has granted the interim injunction on 17.04.2017 (P-2). Even the co-accused, namely, Ashok Kumar and Surinder Kumar have been granted the concession of pre-arrest bail by learned Additional Sessions Judge, Ludhiana vide order dated 03.08.2016 (Annexure P-4).

In view of the above, the order dated 02.04.2018 is made absolute subject to the provisions of Section 438(2) Cr. P.C.

Petition stands disposed off.
