Petitioner seeks the concession of anticipatory bail in FIR No.228 dated 05.08.2017, under Sections 376, 511, 342, 323, 498-A, 120-B IPC, registered at Police Station Sidhwan Bet, District Ludhiana Rural.

Heard learned counsel for the parties.

Petitioner is a cousin brother of the complainant's husband (son of the maternal aunt-Massi). As per allegations in the FIR, the complainant's husband is residing abroad. Allegations of ill-treatment and harassment have been raised by the complainant against all the accused persons i.e. her parents-in-law, husband as well as the present petitioner. Specific allegations in regard to the incident which took place on 02.08.2017, wherein the present petitioner allegedly attempted to commit rape upon the complainant have been levelled in the FIR. The complainant stated that she managed to save herself by locking her door. Her parents came in the morning and she was taken to the hospital at Sidhwan Bet where she was referred to Civil Hospital Jagraon. The present FIR was registered on 05.08.2017.

Argument of learned counsel for the petitioner that the allegations are highly improbable and actuated due to a civil dispute are of no avail, at this stage, for the grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner. The complainant's husband, at this point of time, is admittedly in England and has not joined the present proceedings.

I do not find any ground whatsoever to afford the concession of anticipatory bail to the petitioner.

Petition is accordingly dismissed.
