The petitioner seeks issuance of directions to respondents No. 1 to 3 to decide representation dated 25.01.2018 (Annexure P-6) in a fair and impartial manner.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is a senior citizen and he is being troubled by his son and daughter-in-law i.e. respondents No. 4 and 5. They have thrown him out of his house and the petitioner is now living with his friend. A petition under the Maintenance and Welfare of Parents and Senior Citizens Act, 2007 has been decided but a copy of the final order has not yet been supplied. Meanwhile respondents No. 4 and 5 have become extremely aggressive and are threatening the life and liberty of the petitioner. A representation dated 25.01.2018 (Annexure P-6) has been made to respondent No. 2 but no action is being taken thereupon.

Notice of motion.

Mr. Amandeep S. Gill, Sr. DAG, Punjab accepts notice on behalf of respondents No. 1 to 3. Let four copies of petition be supplied to him during the course of the day.

In view of the nature of order that is being passed there is no necessity

to issue notice to respondents No. 4 and 5 at this stage.

Without commenting upon the merits of the case, the petition is disposed of with directions to respondent No. 2 to look into the allegations made in representation dated 25.01.2018 (Annexure P-6) and conduct an enquiry in which the petitioner shall also be associated. In case, it appears that the life and liberty of the petitioner is being threatened, suitable action be taken to protect the same within a period of two weeks from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order.
