Petitioner-Prem Singh has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.07 dated 11.01.2018, registered at Police Station Patran, District Patiala, under Sections 365, 384, 342, 323, 148, 149 and 506 of the Indian Penal Code and Section 25 of the Arms Act, 1959.

Notice of motion has been issued. Learned State counsel has appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that FIR, in the present case, has been registered on the basis of statement of complainant-Sukhdev Singh.

As per the FIR, the complainant was called by Lalit Kumar @ Lalu.

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When he reached at the spot, the present petitioner alongwith co-accused Harmesh, Lalit Kumar @ Lallu was present there, who forcibly made him to sit in a car and took away him at two-three places. However, they did not cause any injury to the complainant. As per the FIR, they also took meal at some Dhabha and then the accused left the complainant after taking away his cell phone, ₹25,000/- and ATM card. The FIR has been registered by name.

The petitioner has been in custody since 14.01.2018. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping the petitioner in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
