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**GURVINDER SINGH GILL, J. (Oral)**

The petitioners seek quashing of DDR No.25 dated 20.12.2012, under Sections 452, 323, 427, 148 and 149 IPC (later on offence under Section 325 IPC was added), Police Station Bhogpur, District Jalandhar, pertaining to cross-version in FIR No.149 dated 18.12.2012 under Sections 307, 323, 148 and 149 IPC (later on charges were framed under Sections 148, 307, 149, 324, 323, 34 IPC), Police Station Bhogpur, District Jalandhar and proceedings emanating therefrom on the basis of a compromise having been effected between the parties.

Vide order dated 3.4.2018 the parties had been directed to appear before the trial Court/Illaq Magistrate so as to get the statements recorded with regard to the genuineness of the compromise.

Report of learned Additional District and Sessions Judge, Jalandhar has been received wherein it has been reported that Gurminder Singh son of Maluk Singh has since been declared proclaimed offender. It has further been reported that Jagtar Singh is also involved in other cases pertaining to offences under Sections 61/1/2014 of Excise Act, 307, 323, 324, 326, 148, 149, 34 IPC and Daljit Singh is involved in cases pertaining to offences under Sections 61/1/2014 of Excise Act, 307, 323, 324, 326, 148, 149, 363, 366, 365, 376, 506, 120-B IPC and 21/61/85 NDPS Act. Statements of petitioners namely Daljit Singh, Jagtar Singh, Ranjodh Singh, Simranjit Singh and Sharanjit Singh as well as of Jaswinder Singh @ Pinder-complainant and injured Kuldeep Singh and Lakhvir Singh have been recorded who stated that they have compromised the matter and that Jaswinder Singh @ Pinder-complainant and Kuldeep Singh and Lakhvir Singh-injured have no objection if the FIR is quashed.

It has specifically been reported by learned Additional District and Sessions Judge, Jalandhar that in his opinion the compromise effected between the parties appears to be genuine and statements suffered by them in this regard are bona fide and not a result of any pressure or coercion.

Accordingly, in view of the aforesaid compromise wherein a large number of persons have amicably resolved the matter and bearing in mind the law laid down by Full Bench of this Court in 2007(3) RCR (Crl.) 1052 Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab, the petition stands allowed and DDR No.25 dated 20.12.2012, under Sections 452, 323, 427, 148 and 149 IPC (later on offence under Section 325 IPC was added), Police Station Bhogpur, District Jalandhar, pertaining to cross-version in FIR

No.149 dated 18.12.2012 under Sections 307, 323, 148 and 149 IPC (later on charges were framed under Sections 148, 307, 149, 324, 323, 34 IPC), Police Station Bhogpur, District Jalandhar and all the consequent proceedings arising therefrom are hereby quashed.
