This order shall dispose of CRM-M-13611-2018, filed by
petitioner-Paramjit Singh alias Pamma and CRM-M-18467-2018, filed by
petitioners-Swaran Singh, Ranjit Singh and Balbir Singh, under Section

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438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 (for brevity, 'Cr.P.C.') for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.43 dated 05.03.2018, registered at Police Station Tanda, District Hoshiarpur, under Section 21 of the Mines and Minerals (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957.

Notice of motion was issued in both these petitions. Learned State counsel put in appearance on behalf of the respondent-State and contested these petitions.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioners as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that FIR was registered regarding illegal mining. The present petitioners were not apprehended at the spot. They are stated to have run away from there.

In pursuance of the interim orders dated 03.04.2018 passed in CRM-M-13611-2018 and dated 03.05.2018 passed in CRM-M-18467-2018 by this Court, the petitioners have already joined the investigation. They are not required for custodial interrogation. Therefore, no useful purpose will be served by sending them to custody.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts of the case in minute details and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, I find merit in both these petitions and the same are allowed. The orders dated 03.04.2018 passed in CRM-M-13611-2018 and dated 03.05.2018 passed in CRM-M-18467-2018, granting interim bail to the petitioners, are made absolute. However, the petitioners shall join the investigation as and when called upon to do so and

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shall abide by the conditions of Section 438 (2) Cr.P.C.
