By this petition, quashing of FIR No.88 dated 10.06.2011, initially registered against the petitioners at Police Station City Batala, for the alleged commission of offences punishable under Sections 452/323/324/427/506/148/149 IPC, (an offence punishable under Section 326 IPC having been added later), is sought, on the basis of a compromise arrived at between the petitioners (accused) and respondent no. 2 (complainant).

Vide an order of this Court dated 24.04.2017, the parties were directed to appear before the trial Court to get their statements recorded, in terms of the compromise.

Pursuant to the aforesaid order, the report of the Sub Divisional Judicial Magistrate, Batala, has been received, stating therein that the statements of the petitioners, i.e. accused in the FIR in question, as also of respondent no.2, i.e. the complainant Mukesh Kumar, were recorded in support of the compromise reached between the parties. As per the assessment of the learned Magistrate the compromise has been reached voluntarily, without any pressure from either side.

In view of the above and keeping in view the ratio of the law laid down by the Supreme Court in Gian Singh vs. State of Punjab and others, (2012) 10 SCC 303, as also seeing the nature of offences, including the fact that there was no injury on any vital part of the body, it would be pointless to continue with the criminal proceedings, the parties having fully compromised the matter of their own free will, the injuries received by them being simple injuries.

Consequently, the petition is allowed and FIR No. 88 dated 10.06.2011, registered against the petitioners at police Station City Batala, for alleged alleged commission of offences punishable under Sections 452/323/324/326/427/506/148/149 IPC, alongwith all consequential proceedings emanating therefrom, is hereby quashed.
