Prayer in the present petition filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 is for issuance of direction to respondents no.1 to 3 to protect the life, liberty and property of the petitioner-Mohinder Singh, aged 74 years, who is father of respondent no.4 Baljinder Singh.

Vide order dated 19.09.2018, since the dispute was between father and son, the matter was referred to the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this Court for amicable settlement

Accordingly, the parties have appeared before the Mediation and Conciliation Centre.

As per the report of the Mediation and Conciliation Centre, the matter has been compromised between the parties. The relevant extract of the said report reads as under:-

“The following compromise/settlement has been arrived at between the parties hereto:

- a) It is agreed by the second party that in future neither they will misbehave nor will stop providing food to the first party.*
- b) It is further agreed by the second party that in future they will never throw out the first party from the house nor will they abuse, humiliate the first party.*
- c) It is agreed by the second party that in future they will not give any sort of threats and will also not mentally torture the first party.*
- d) It is agreed by the second party that they will not give continuous threats to the first party by saying that they will take poison and falsely implicate the first party in false case.*
- e) It is agreed that the second party will take care of all the needs of the first party and will fulfil all their responsibilities towards the first party.*
- f) That as per the parties, except the present CRM-M petition, no other Civil or Criminal limitation is pending between the parties. Both the parties further undertake that they will not file any Civil or Criminal litigation against each other in future with regard to the present dispute.”*

In view of the settlement so arrived between the parties, the compromise/settlement deed dated 29.10.2018 is taken on record as Mark-

X.

Accordingly, the present petition is disposed, as having been rendered infructuous.
