Prayer in this petition, filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C., is for transfer of the investigation in FIR No. 06 dated 19.01.2018, under Section 306 IPC, registered at Police Station GRP, Patiala to some other agency.

Reply, by way of affidavit of DSP, Sub-Division Govt. Railway Police, Patiala, is on record. In the said reply, it is stated that during investigation, the investigation of this case is transferred to Assistant Inspector General, Investigation-1, Bureau of Investigation, Punjab, Chandigarh by order of the Director General of Police, Punjab, vide order dated 16.05.2018.

Learned Additional Public Prosecutor, Chandigarh also submits

that investigation of FIR No. 17 dated 10.01.2018, under Sections 307, 458 and 506 of the IPC and Section 20 of the Arms Act, 1959, registered at Police Station Sector 34, Chandigarh stands transferred to Crime Branch, Chandigarh, vide office order of the SSP, Chandigarh dated 26.07.2018 directing the DSP, Crime Branch to supervise the further investigation.

In view of the above, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that this petition may be rendered infructuous, at this stage, with liberty to file afresh, if so required.

Dismissed as infructuous with liberty as prayed for.
