Present petition has been filed under Section 482 Cr.P.C for issuance of direction to official respondents to file the status report in the Calendra under Section 182 IPC, Police Station Chandimandir, District Panchkula.

In pursuance of the notice of motion issued by this Court, reply by way of affidavit of Pawan Kumar, HPS Assistant Commissioner of Police, Kalka on behalf of respondents no. 1 to 5 has been filed which *inter alia* states that:-

"The enquiry of the same was conducted by Sh.Dalip Kumar, HPS, the then Assistant Commissioner of Police, Headquarter Panchkula. As per his report calendra was prepared against respondent no.7 and 8 also by the SHO but in the meantime respondent no.6 was discharged by the learned Court therefore calendrda was not filed against respondent no.6 to 8 as till then prescribed period was lapsed. However, petitioner Bhupender Singh was not satisfied with the action taken against respondents no.6 to 8. Therefore, matter for taking appropriate action against, the then SHO, Police

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Station Chandimandir and Asstt. Sub Inspector Pawan Kumar was referred to the Deputy Commissioner of Police for taking action for the lapses. The Deputy Commissioner of Police Panchkula had warned the ASI Pawan Kumar and the then SHO, Chandimandir, Inspector Suraj Kumar for being negligent and they were directed not to be negligent in future. Copy of the order is annexed herewith as Annexure P-9.”

In view of the above, no further directions are required to be issued by this Court while entertaining the present petition.

If petitioner is still dissatisfied with the action taken in the matter, he may take recourse to the remedy available under law.

Disposed off in the above terms.
