The instant petition has been filed under Section 482 of the Code of Criminal Procedure seeking a direction to respondents No. 2 to 4 to take strict legal action on the complaint dated 13.3.2018 (Annexures P/3) submitted by the petitioner to respondent No. 2.

It is contended that the petitioner and respondent No.5 were in physical relation and he had promised to marry the petitioner. But now respondent No. 5 has flatly refused to marry the petitioner. Consequently, the petitioner has made the complaint dated 13.3.2018 for taking action against respondent No.5 but of no avail.

Notice of motion to the official respondents.

At this stage, on the asking of the court Mr. A.S. Sandhu, Additional Advocate General, Punjab, accepts notice on behalf of the official respondents and submits that official respondents will look into the

matter and will decide the complaint of the petitioner within a period of three months, on receipt of certified copy of this order. Let sufficient number of copies of the paper book be supplied to him during the course of the day.

In view of the above, I dispose of the instant petition by directing the official respondents to decide the complaint dated 13.3.2018 (Annexure P-1) of the petitioner within a period of three months from the date of receipt of certified copy of this order, in accordance with law.

The petition stands disposed of in the above-said terms.
