Though the learned State counsel opposes the petition seeking bail to the petitioner, on the ground that the charge is still to be framed, however, learned counsel for the petitioner points out that the recovery of poppy husk alleged to have been made from the petitioner and his co-accused, Gurtej Singh, was 54 Kgs, which is marginally above the commercial quantity, with the said Gurtej Singh already having been admitted to bail by this Court vide an order dated 25.04.2018, passed in CRM-16022-2018.

Keeping in view the fact that Gurtej Singh and the petitioner both, alongwith Mandeep Singh, are stated to have been apprehended with the poppy husk (as per the case of the prosecution), and Gurtej Singh has been admitted to bail by this Court, with the petitioner also having undergone 6 months and 29 days of actual custody, with no other criminal case shown to be registered against him, as per the custody certificate filed in Court today by the learned State counsel, I consider it appropriate to admit

him to bail, on his furnishing adequate bail and surety bonds to the satisfaction of the trial Court.
