Petitioner has prayed for quashing of FIR on the basis of compromise. FIR was registered on the complainant of Harjit Singh. He is stated that on 28.9.2017, he was going on motorcycle to meet his friend. When he reached near chowk Tahliwala near shop of Masoon Jewellers, 3 boys came on pulsar motorcycle. One of them asked the complainant to hand over the motorcycle, failing which, he would shoot him. As the complainant tried to catch hold of the accused, one of them fired two shots. Out of fear the complainant relented and the motorcycle was taken away by the accused.

Keeping in view the nature of allegations, this court is of the view that no case for quashing of FIR on the basis of compromise is made out. Offences of this nature are against the society and the State. It is necessary that investigation is taken to its logical end in order to ensure that no such crime of similar nature occurs in the area.

Petition is without any merit and is hereby dismissed.
