The instant petition has been filed under Section 438 of Cr.P.C., for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in FIR No.86 dated 07.04.2017, under Sections 498-A, 406, 506, 342, 34 of the Indian Penal Code, registered at Police Station Women, Sector 51, Gurugram.

By an order dated 09.05.2017, while issuing the notice of motion, the petitioner had been directed to join the investigation within a period of 10 days. This court is informed that the petitioner did join the investigation on 15.05.2017. Thereafter, the parties were directed to appear before the Mediation and Conciliation Centre of this court on 01.08.2017.

However, the mediation seems to have been unsuccessful, despite the attempt being made by the mediators and this court itself.

Learned counsel appearing on behalf of State of Haryana as well as counsel for the complainant submit that recoveries are yet to be made.

At this stage, learned counsel for the petitioner submits that the petitioner is ready to deposit Rs.3,50,000/- with the Illaqa Magistrate, in lieu of the alleged recoveries that are yet to be effected.

I have heard learned counsel for the parties.

In view of the above, let the amount of Rs.3,50,000/- be deposited with the Illaqa Magistrate, in lieu of the alleged recoveries within a period of four weeks, to be disbursed in case, the complainant is successful in her allegations.

With the aforesaid directions, at this stage, without commenting on the merits of the case, the petition is allowed and order dated 09.05.2017 granting interim bail to the petitioner is made absolute subject to the conditions laid down in Section 438 Sub Section 2 Clauses (i)(ii) and (iii) of the Code of Criminal Procedure.
