The present petition has been filed under Section 438 Code of Criminal Procedure for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioner in case FIR No.173 dated 7.12.2016 registered for the offences punishable under Sections 406, 420, 120-B IPC, at Police Station Amloh, District Fatehgarh Sahib.

It is the case of the prosecution that petitioner-Kamaljit Kaur along with her husband had duped numerous people in the huge amount running in lacs of rupees. Earlier they moved application before the learned Sessions Court, Fatehgarh Sahib which was dismissed.

On the previous date, i.e., on 16.12.2017, learned counsel for

the petitioner sought adjournment in regard to deposit of ₹ 6.60 lacs but today he has denied for depositing this amount.

I have heard the learned counsel for the parties and gone through the record.

Serious allegation has been levelled against the petitioner and her husband. Even she submitted an affidavit and also issued various receipts which clearly establishes her involvement in the crime.

Keeping in view the above, this Court is of the considered opinion that no ground is made out for grant of anticipatory bail as such the present petition is dismissed.
