DAYA CHAUDHARY, J.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that the petitioner was granted regular bail and was appearing before the trial Court on each and every date. Subsequently the petitioner could not appear before the trial Court as he was suffering from Hepatitis C and was declared as proclaimed offender. Learned counsel further contends that the petitioner undertakes to appear before the trial Court on each and every day and to abide by all the terms and conditions to be imposed by this Court or by the trial Court. Learned counsel also contends that recovery of alleged contraband is marginally more than the small quantity.

Learned counsel for respondent-State submits that one more case under NDPS Act is pending against the petitioner and he remained

absent from the Court proceedings for a period of more than two and a half years.

Keeping in view the submissions made by learned counsel for the petitioner, the present petition is disposed of with a direction to the petitioner to surrender before the trial Court within a period of ten days and in case he surrenders before the trial Court and moves an application for regular bail, the same shall be considered within a period of seven days thereafter in accordance with law.

Disposed of accordingly.
