DEEPAK SIBAL, J. (ORAL)

Through this petition filed under Section 438 Cr.P.C., the petitioner seeks the concession of anticipatory bail in FIR No.84, dated 21.04.2017, registered under Sections 323, 324, 506 and 34 IPC (Sections 326 and 452 IPC added later-on), at Police Station Meharban, District Ludhiana.

On 22.05.2017, while issuing notice of motion, this Court had granted ad-interim anticipatory bail to the petitioner on his furnishing bail bonds to the satisfaction of the arresting/investigating officer.

A perusal of the FIR shows that the injury attributed to the petitioner is on the wrist of the left arm of the complainant i.e. a non-vital part. Further, it is yet to be determined as to whether the said injury was inflicted by the petitioner in the course of self-defence or otherwise.

Learned State counsel, on instructions from ASI Hardip Singh, submits that the investigation in the matter is complete as report under Section 173 Cr.P.C. has been filed and before submission of the report the

petitioner not only joined the investigation but fully cooperated with the investigating agency. He further submits that at this stage, the petitioner is not required for any further investigation.

In view of the above, the order dated 22.05.2017, granting ad-interim anticipatory bail to the petitioner, subject to the conditions prescribed under Section 438(2) Cr.P.C., requires to be made absolute.

Ordered accordingly.

Nothing observed herein-above shall be considered to be an expression of opinion by this Court on the merits of the case.

During the period that the bail is granted to the petitioner, if he is found indulging in any criminal/illegal activity or misusing the concession of bail granted by this Court, it would be open to the State to move an appropriate application before the competent Court/this Court for cancellation of the bail granted to the petitioner.
