Prayer in this petition is for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners in FIR No.73 dated 08.04.2017 registered under Sections 302, 323, 148 and 149 IPC at Police Station Cantonment, Amritsar.

Counsel for the petitioners has submitted that the petitioners, though, named in the FIR, however, no specific role is attributed to them. It is further submitted that as per the allegation in the FIR, the injuries are attributed to other co-accused. It is further submitted that 02 of the co-accused namely Jyoti and Lal Chand @ Lali have been granted the concession of regular bail vide orders dated 25.09.2017 and 12.03.2018 passed in CRM-M Nos.31108 of 2017 and No.8963 of 2018.

Counsel for the State, on instructions from ASI Avtar Singh, has, however, opposed the prayer for bail on the ground that as per the FIR, both the injuries were on the forehead/head of the deceased Abhishek @ Janu.

After hearing the counsel for the parties, I find no merit in

the present petition. A perusal of the FIR show that the complainant Deepika, as per her version given in the statement recorded under Section 161 Cr.P.C. (Annexure P1), has specifically named both the petitioners to be present at the spot, armed with their respective weapons along with other co-accused and the accused persons caused injuries to the deceased with hammer and other weapons. The complainant has specifically stated that petitioner No.2 Deep son of Lal Chand attacked with his dang on the head of Shami, which hit him near the left ear then, Jyoti daughter of Lal Chand attacked Shami with her dang which hit him near the elbow of his right arm and Manju – petitioner No.1 wife of Lal Chand snatched bat from his son-in-law Suraj and hit on the left arm of Shami. It may be noticed here that the FIR pertains to 10.04.2017 and till date, the petitioners have not surrendered before the police and are escaping from the process of law.

In view of above, no ground for grant of anticipatory bail to the petitioners is made out.

Dismissed.
