GURVINDER SINGH GILL, J.(Oral)

By way of filing this petition, the petitioners seek quashing of FIR No.60 dated 2.5.2015 registered at Police Station Dehlon, District Ludhiana under Sections 447, 511, 427, 506, 148, 149 and 120-B of Indian Penal Code, 1860 and all consequential proceedings emanating therefrom on the basis of a compromise having been effected between the parties.

Vide order dated 2.6.2017, the parties had been directed to appear before the Illaqa Magistrate/concerned Court so as to get their statements recorded qua the factum of compromise.

Reports of learned Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Ludhiana has been received to the effect that the statements of petitioners/accused Jaspal Singh, Manjinder Singh @ Mani, Sadhu Singh, Kuldeep Singh have been recorded on 9.6.2017 and also of accused/petitioner Ajaib Singh has been recorded on 13.6.2017 to the effect that they have compromised the matter

with the complainant. Statement of complainant has also been recorded to the effect that he has compromised the matter with the petitioners/accused and they have no objection in case the FIR is quashed.

It has specifically been opined by learned Judicial Magistrate 1st Class, Ludhiana that the parties have entered into compromise voluntarily and without there being any pressure, coercion or undue influence.

In view of the aforesaid compromise and bearing in mind the law laid down by Full Bench of this Court in 2007(3) RCR (Crl.) 1052 Kulwinder Singh and others Vs. State of Punjab, the petition is allowed and FIR No.60 dated 2.5.2015 registered at Police Station Dehlon, District Ludhiana under Sections 447, 511, 427, 506, 148, 149 and 120-B of Indian Penal Code, 1860 and all the consequent proceedings arising therefrom are hereby quashed qua the petitioners.
