MANOJ BAJAJ, J.

By filing the present petition under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, the petitioner has sought anticipatory bail in FIR No.99 dated 21.03.2018 registered under Sections 420, 467, 468 and 471 of the Indian Penal Code at Police Station Ferozepur Jhirkha, District Mewat-Nuh.

Status report by way of affidavit of Birem Singh, HPS, Deputy Superintendent of Police, Ferozepur Jhirkha on behalf of respondent-State has been filed and the same is taken on record. As per the report, the petitioner has joined the investigation which has led to the recovery of a laptop. Similarly, it is also mentioned that co-accused, namely, Mohammad Asfak @ Alam has also joined the investigation. However, nothing has led to the recovery. It is mentioned that the custodial interrogation is required to unearth the truth.

On 30.05.2018 this Court had passed the following order:-

“Counsel for the petitioner states that the petitioner is ready and willing to join investigation and co-operate with the same and would hand over whatever documents and other things, which are required for the said purpose.

In view of the above, let the petitioner join investigation before ASI Chander Pal, Police Station Ferozepur Jhirka on 06.06.2018 at 10 A.M.

List on 12.09.2018.

In the meanwhile, in the event of the arrest of the petitioner, he shall be released on bail to the satisfaction of the Arresting Officer, subject to the conditions contained in Section 438 (2) Cr. P.C. He will join the investigation as and when required.

Learned counsel for the petitioner contends that in pursuance of the order dated 30.05.2018, the petitioner has joined the investigation.

Learned State counsel on instructions from SI Ravinder Kumar submits that the petitioner has joined the investigation and he is not required for custodial interrogation.

In view of the above, the interim bail granted by this Court vide order dated 30.05.2018, is made absolute.

The petition stands allowed.
