Petitioner-Soma Singh has filed this petition under Section 438 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 (for brevity, 'Cr.P.C.') for grant of anticipatory bail in case FIR No.27 dated 26.04.2018, registered at Police Station Badali Ala Singh, District Fatehgarh Sahib, under Sections 379, 411 and 473 of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion has been issued in this case. Learned State counsel has put in appearance on behalf of the respondent-State and contested this petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and have gone through the record.

From the record, I find that though, the present petitioner is not named in the FIR which has been registered on the basis of secret

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information against co-accused, Ranjit Singh, but he has been nominated on the basis of statement of co-accused, Ranjit Singh. As per learned State counsel, four stolen motor-cycles have been recovered from his premises, however, he fled away from the spot. Even as per the order dated 10.05.2018 passed by learned Additional Sessions Judge, Fatehgarh Sahib, one of the motor-cycles was cut and converted into a '*rehri*'.

Keeping in view the fact that there are serious allegations against the present petitioner and in view of the fact that he is required for custodial interrogation, I do not find it a fit case where the petitioner is entitled to the benefit of anticipatory bail.

Therefore, finding no merit in the present petition, the same is dismissed.
