Petitioner-Mukhraj Singh has filed this petition under Section 439 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973 for grant of regular bail in case FIR No.88 dated 18.08.2017, registered at Police Station GRP Bathinda, District Bathinda, under Sections 306 and 34 of the Indian Penal Code.

Notice of motion was issued. Learned State counsel appeared and contested the instant petition.

I have heard learned counsel for the petitioner as well as learned State counsel and gone through the record.

From the record, I find that as per the FIR, Darshan Singh, son of complainant had married with Sukhwinder Kaur. There was some matrimonial dispute between them. As per the allegations, on

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11.08.2018, there was some quarrel between them and Sukhwinder Kaur called her parents. Thereafter, present petitioner (Mukhraj Singh) alongwith his brother, father, mother came there and as per the FIR, Sukhwinder Kaur alongwith her parents, brothers and children went to her matrimonial home. She also filed some application against Darshan Singh at Police Station Boha, District Mansa. There is further averment in the FIR that Darshan Singh was depressed and as per the information received by the complainant, he committed suicide on 18.08.2017 by jumping before a train. His suicide note was found there.

The petitioner has been in custody since 20.04.2018. He is not required for any investigation or interrogation purposes as he is in judicial custody. The trial of the case will take long time. No useful purpose will be served by keeping him in custody till the final disposal of the case.

Keeping in view the facts and circumstances of the present case; without discussing the facts in minute detail and without expressing any opinion on the merits of the case, this criminal miscellaneous petition is allowed and the petitioner is ordered to be released on bail subject to his furnishing personal bonds in the sum of ₹50,000/- with one surety in the like amount to the satisfaction of the trial Court/Duty Magistrate.
