According to the affidavit dated 9.7.2018 (Annexure P-9) filed by the petitioner, petitioner has stated that he has no objection if the witnesses are examined in his absence before the trial Court in this case.

2. Learned counsel for the State opposed the plea of the petitioner stating that if the petitioner is not available for the purpose of proceedings, trial may hamper. Therefore, he is not entitled for permission to go abroad.

3. Once the petitioner himself has given an undertaking by means of an affidavit to the extent that he has no objection if the witnesses are examined in his absence before the trial court, the same could be taken into consideration to proceed with the matter further before the trial Court.

4. In view of these facts and circumstances, petitioner is permitted to go abroad from 2nd week of August 2018 to 2nd week of November 2018 on his furnishing requisite surety bonds to the entire satisfaction of the Trial Court.

5. Petition stands allowed accordingly.
