The instant petition under Section 482 Cr.P.C. has been filed by the petitioner seeking issuance of a direction to official respondents No.1 to 3 for conducting a fair and impartial inquiry in representations dated 12.03.2018 and 30.04.2018 (Annexure P-1 & P-2) and further directing the official respondents to take legal action against the private respondents as per law.

Learned counsel for the petitioner submits that at the present moment he would be satisfied if respondent No.2 be directed to look into the representations dated 12.03.2018 and 30.04.2018 (Annexure P-1 & P-2) and take action in accordance with law, in a time bound manner.

Notice of motion.

On asking of the Court, Mr. Nikhil K. Chopra, Addl. A.G., Punjab, who is present in the Court, accepts notice on behalf of respondent-

State. Learned counsel for the petitioner undertakes to supply adequate number of copies of the petition to the State counsel during the course of the day failing which no action is called for. He submits that representations dated 12.03.2018 and 30.04.2018 (Annexure P-1 & P-2) will be decided within a period of four weeks.
