Petitioner has approached this Court praying for a direction to the official respondents to take action against respondents 4 and 5 for falsely implicating the petitioner and others in one case or the other.

On considering the submissions made by the counsel for the petitioner, it appears that the dispute primarily is relatable to the control of the *dera* and in that context, claim, counter claims and complaints are being filed by the parties, which are being inquired into by the police authorities.

Counsel for the petitioner states that no complaint has been filed by the petitioner.

Be that as it may, the fact remains that filing of complaints cannot be stopped by a judicial order by a particular person, if he feels aggrieved by some action which would violate any provision of the statute or law.

The present petition is filed under total misconception.

The same, therefore, stands dismissed.
